Cha-cha done now or later ?

Another major consultation among the people discussing as to whether changes and amendments in our Constitution should be made now or in the later future was expounded last Wednesday during the 8th leg of the traveling forum, by authors and experts in the Charter during a gathering at St. Paul University Dumaguete auditorium.

Consultative Commission (ConCom) Chairman Dr. Jose Abueva and Concom member and former Senator Vicente T. Paterno presented before the public, the pros and cons of the proposed constitutional reforms.

Lawyer-Gov. George Arnaiz, together with Rev. Fr. Gamaliel Tulabing, diocesan chancellor and Filipino-Chinese Chamber of Commerce Negros Oriental Chapter President Alex Sy, composed the panel of reactors during the forum.

In the midst of what he calls is the most extensive discussion on Charter Change in Philippine history, Consultative Commission (ConCom) Chairman Dr. Jose Abueva said

that the country has a better shot at effective governance, progress and realization of our goals as a nation with a parliamentary system compared to the current presidential form of government.

Paterno, who sits as director of a slew of corporations including the First Philippine Holdings Corporation, said that he agrees "in principle" to a constitutional reform but he questioned why there's a rush to change the charter when it can be done later at the proper time.

But Abueva, a social scientist who is the Founding President and Chairman of the Kalayaan College and also University Professor Emeritus of
